



eRx is ePIP Compliant

- General Practitioners (GPs) can receive an incentive payment for sending electronic prescriptions to eRx.
- The Practice Incentives Program eHealth Incentive (ePIP) aims to encourage general practices to keep up to date with the latest developments in eHealth. The eHealth incentives guidelines were updated on 1 May 2016.
- Electronic Transfer of Prescriptions is Requirement 4 of ePIP. GPs must ensure that the majority of their prescriptions are sent electronically to a Prescription Exchange Service such as eRx.

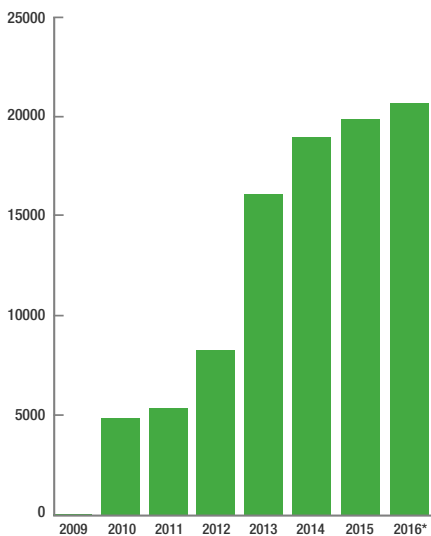

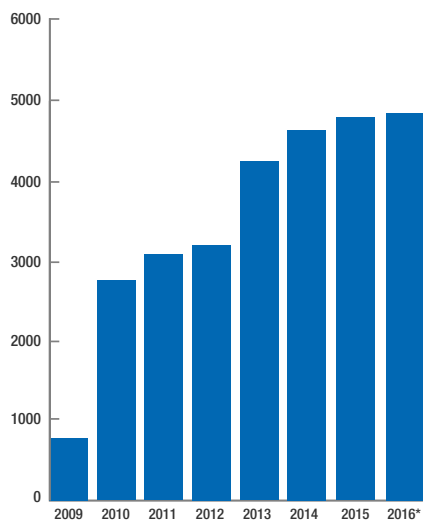

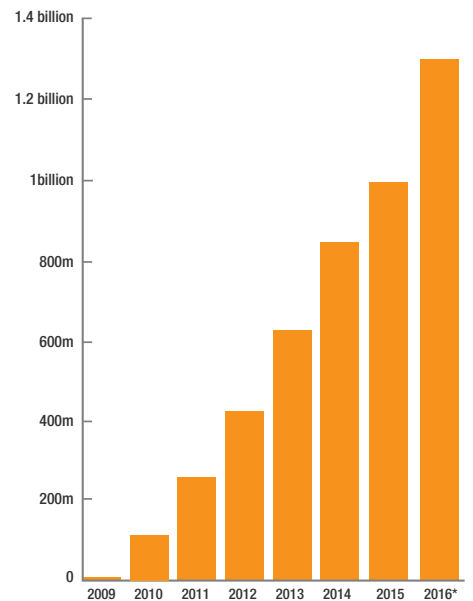
